CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER

We have included a brief overview of the Examen, Centering Prayer, and Lectio Divina for you to use as a group. These may take a bit of practice or further research if you are new to these practices.

Text is to be read aloud by one person. You may like to take turns reading sections going around the circle.

Read through a section of the bible, or follow the SWBC Daily Readings.

Pick songs well known to your group or select one from the Song section p29.

Prayers that are led by someone often with sections to read together.

Readings can come from devotional books (eg. Henri Nouwen, Mother Teresa Daily readings) or from the SWBC Daily Readings.


A space to pray together. You may want to light candles or use stones to symbolise prayers.

COMMUNION


The bread and wine are handed around.

Selected Prayers



If you want to make your prayer time together a bit more dynamic, this can be a good way of praying in a way that suits your context and your people. Here is a suggested flow for your prayer time. Take turns to pray and read or share. It can help to simply move around the circle, or designate roles for people before you start.

OPENING PRAYER

Pray a prayer or choose from the 'Opening Prayer' section.

SCRIPTURE READING

Follow the SWBC Daily Readings or read through a book of the Bible.

SONG

GROUP PRAYER

Pray a prayer or choose from 'Group Prayers' or 'Lord Prayers'

READING

Devotional reading.

PRAYER TIME

You may want to set up candles to light symbolically for each prayer. Setting up a cross or centre focus point can help create space for prayers. Praying **Lord hear our prayer**. collectively after each prayer, spoken or silent, can be a wonderful way of supporting each other's prayers.

Contemplative Prayer



Examen

A great way to pray is to look for God's presence our lives. More than 400 years ago St. Ignatius Loyola encouraged prayer-filled mindfulness by proposing what has been called the Daily Examen.

The Examen is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to detect God's presence and to discern God's direction for us. St Ignatius encouraged people to talk to Jesus like a friend.

End the Daily Examen with a conversation with Jesus. Ask forgiveness for your sins. Ask for God's protection and help. Ask for God's wisdom about the questions you have and the problems you face. Do all this in the spirit of gratitude.

Your life is a gift, and it is adorned with gifts from God.

You might like to end the Daily Examen with the Lord's Prayer (see p16).

- 1. **Become aware of God's presence**. Look back on the events of the day in the company of the Holy Spirit. The day may seem confusing to you—a blur, a jumble, a muddle. Ask God to bring clarity and understanding.
- 2. Review the day with gratitude. Gratitude is the foundation of our relationship with God. Walk through your day in the presence of God and note its joys and delights. Focus on the day's gifts. Look at the work you did, the people you interacted with. What did you receive from these people? What did you give them? Pay attention to small things—the food you ate, the sights you saw, and other seemingly small pleasures. God is in the details.
- 3. Pay attention to your emotions. One of St. Ignatius's great insights was that we detect the presence of the Spirit of God in the movements of our emotions. Reflect on the feelings you experienced during the day. Boredom? Elation? Resentment? Compassion? Anger? Confidence? What is God saying through these feelings?

God will most likely show you some ways that you fell short. Make note of these sins and faults. But look deeply for other implications. Does a feeling of frustration perhaps mean that God wants you consider a new direction in some area of your work? Are you concerned about a friend? Perhaps you should reach out to her in some way.

- 4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct you to something during the day that God thinks is particularly important. It may involve a feeling—positive or negative. It may be a significant encounter with another person or a vivid moment of pleasure or peace. Or it may be something that seems rather insignificant. Look at it. Pray about it. Allow the prayer to arise spontaneously from your heart—whether intercession, praise, repentance, or gratitude.
- 5. Look toward tomorrow. Ask God to give you light for tomorrow's challenges. Pay attention to the feelings that surface as you survey what's coming up. Are you doubtful? Cheerful? Apprehensive? Full of delighted anticipation? Allow these feelings to turn into prayer. Seek God's guidance. Ask him for help and understanding. Pray for hope.

Lectio Divina

Lectio divina is the Latin term for divine or sacred reading. It originated with the Benedictines in the Middle Ages as a way of reading scripture, meditating on it, and praying with it. The purpose is to help people connect with God by becoming more familiar with the Bible as the living Word, active in our lives. So often we read the Bible without allowing it to shape our lives. Lectio divina will help us linger over the words, rather than just zipping past them with no transforming effect on us.

Traditionally there are four steps to lectio divina: reading, meditation, prayer and contemplation. A fifth, action is often added.

Choose a text for your reading. Accounts of the life of Jesus life are a great place to start. If you are in a group, choose the passage in advance and allow about 15 minutes for the prayer and sharing time.

READING

Read the chosen text slowly. Listen for a word or brief phrase that catches your attention. Just listen to it, hold onto it, without trying to analyse it. In a group setting, take time for everyone to speak their word aloud to the group—just the word without any explanation.

MEDITATION

The second time you read the passage, ponder that word. Take it from your head to your heart. Ask why it caught your attention? How does it connect with your life at the moment? What might God be saying through this word?

PR AYER.

After several minutes of meditation, begin a conversation with God. How are you being invited to pray? Allow the word to touch you deeply as you pray. Listen for God's reassuring, comforting voice.

CONTEMPLATION

Quietly rest in God's presence as you complete your prayer. Let go of words and enjoy being held in God's love.

ACTION

Consider what God might be asking you to do in response to what you have sensed in this time. A new approach to something or someone? Or something you intend to do?

If you are in a group, you could share in pairs what you have received, and any action you intend to take.

Centering Prayer

Centering Prayer is a silent prayer. Silent prayer adds depth and meaning to the other forms of prayer we practice. In the silence we experience God's presence with us. Centering Prayer teaches us to "withdraw attention from our thoughts – those incessant creations of our busy mind – in order to rest in a gentle, open attentiveness to divine reality."

Centering Prayer is not difficult to do, in fact one of the challenges is not to complicate it! You simply sit in silence for 20 minutes in an attitude of consenting to God's presence and action in your life. It can be done alone, or in a group. All you need is a quiet space and some way of keeping an eye on the time. It may be helpful to have someone who has practiced Centering Prayer for a while lead your group through the prayer in the beginning.

- 1. Choose a sacred word. Your word is the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within. If this is your first experience of Centering Prayer, take a few minutes now to choose a word of one or two syllables, such as: God, Jesus, Abba, Father, Mother, Mary, Amen. Other possibilities include: Love, Listen, Peace, Mercy, Let Go, Silence, Stillness, Faith, Trust. Stick with one sacred word for the prayer period.
- 2. Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within. "Sitting comfortably" means relatively comfortably so as not to encourage sleep during the time of prayer. It's best to keep your back straight, and close your eyes to let go of what is going on around.
- 3. When engaged with your thoughts, return ever-so gently to the sacred word. "Thoughts" is an umbrella term for every perception—body sensations, feelings, images, memories, plans, reflections, commentaries, and even spiritual experiences. Don't feel bad about them—thoughts are an inevitable and normal part of Centering Prayer.
- 4. At the end, remain in silence with your eyes closed for a couple of minutes. This enables us to bring the atmosphere of silence into everyday life. If the prayer is done in a group, the leader might slowly recite a prayer such as the Lord's Prayer, while the others listen.
